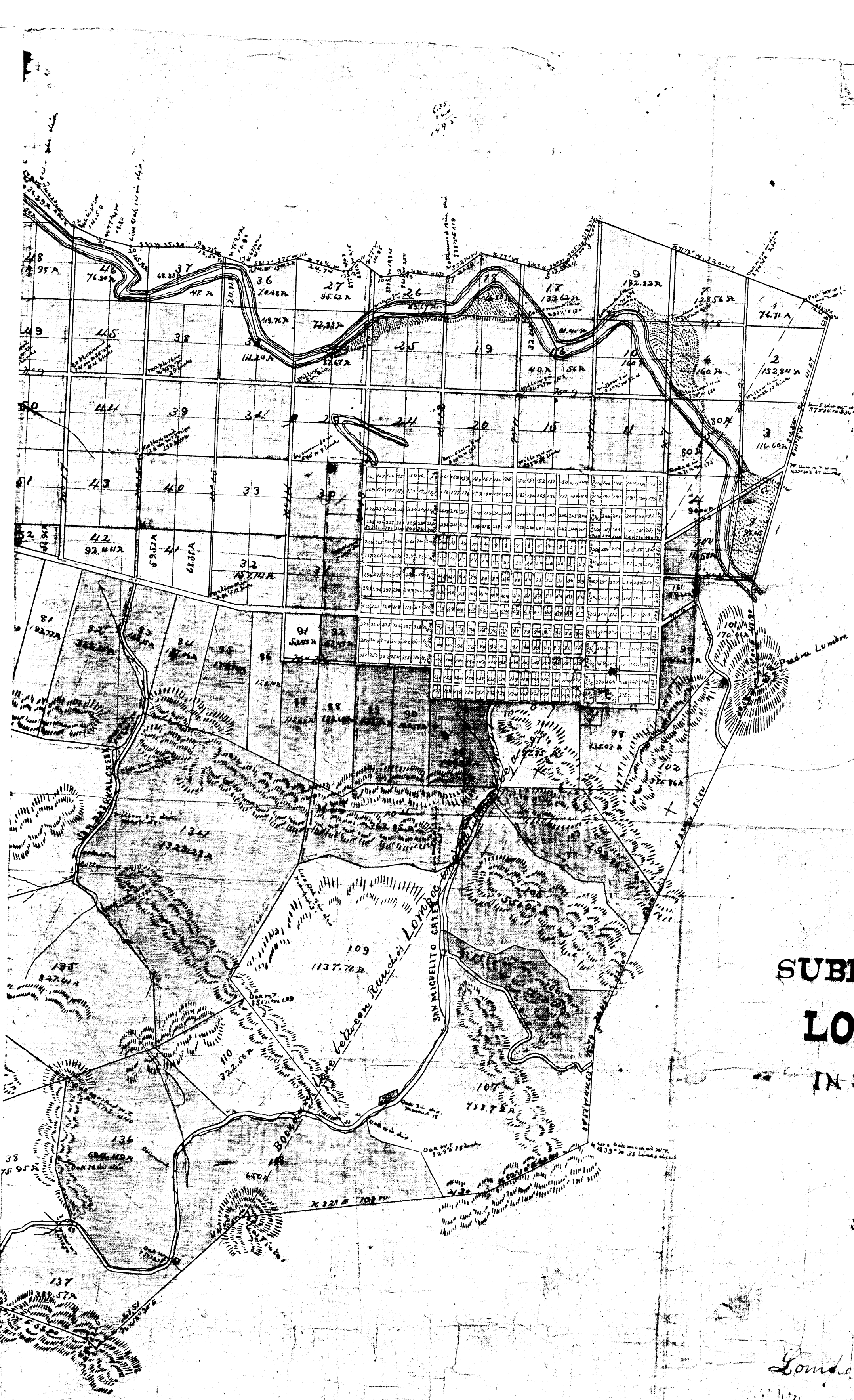
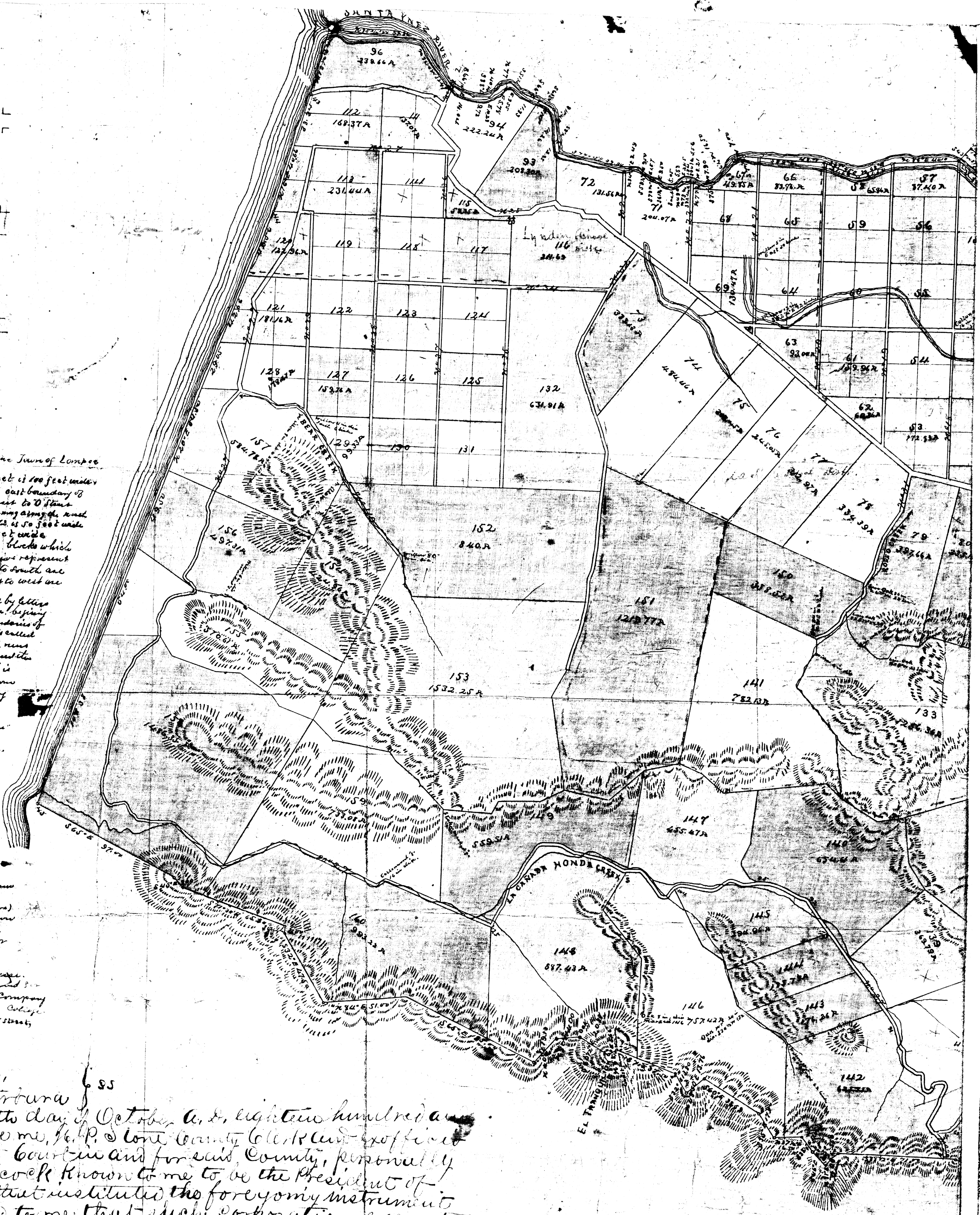

NOTES EXPLANATORY OF THE MAP OF THE TOWN OF LOMPOC

FILED OCT. 10, 1977

B-1-P. 45

Ocean Avenue is 130 feet wide

"H" Street, is 100 feet wide

Willow Avenue from "A" Street to the east boundary of the town is 80 feet wide and from "A" Street to "O" Street it is 30 feet wide.

Cemetery Avenue running along the north and east boundaries of suburban Block No. 372 is 50 feet wide. All of the other streets are 80 feet wide.

The red lines drawn through the blocks which are numbered from 1 to 140 inclusive represent alleys. The alleys running from north to south are 20 feet wide; those running from east to west are 25 feet wide.

The streets are named as follows:

First by letters of the Alphabet from A to O, inclusive, beginning with the one which runs along the east boundary of Blocks 1, 28, 29, 56, 57, 84, 85, 112, 113 & 140 which is called "A" Street, and ending with the one which runs along the west boundary of Block No. 14 and the blocks lying immediately south of "A", which is called "O Street".

Second - those running from east to west are named as follows:

Beginning with the one which runs along the south boundary of the town: "Willow Avenue", "Locust Avenue", "Olive Avenue", "Hichory Avenue", "Cypress Avenue", "Ocean Avenue", "Walnut Avenue", "Chestnut Avenue", "Laurel Avenue", "Maple Avenue", "College Avenue":

The numbers of the blocks are written with blue ink: their sizes (in feet) are written with black ink.

The blocks bounded by "Ocean Avenue", Walnut Avenue and A and O Streets are subdivided and numbered as shown on the above diagram of Block No. 63.

The blocks bounded by Ocean Avenue, Cypress Avenue and A & O Streets are subdivided and numbered as shown on the above diagram of Block No. 78. All other blocks from No. 1 to No. 140 (inclusive) are subdivided and numbered as shown on the above diagram of Block No. 91. Blocks Nos. 35 and 106 are reserved for plazas.

Block No. 36, reserved for public schools.

Block No. 105 is reserved for a court House.

Lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Block No. 92 are reserved for the use of the Lompoc Valley Land Company.

Blocks Nos. 239 and 240 are reserved for a college.

Willow Avenue is closed from "A" Street to "I" Street, and is added to Lot 97.

Lot No. 23 is closed.
